# **Rules & Regulations**

The Regulations of The Royal Agricultural Society (Inc.) shall apply to this show except where otherwise stated.

- Every exhibit, except livestock, must be grown by or be the work of the exhibitor who may be called to make an affidavit to that effect.
- The Committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving reason for doing so.
- The Judges may withhold prizes for such exhibits as they deem unworthy.
- Should only two exhibits be shown in any one class, no second prize will be awarded, unless in the opinion of the judge such exhibit could have gained a prize had there been a further competition.
- No appeal against the decision of the judges will be entertained unless made in writing before 4pm on show day and a deposit of \$20.00 will be lodged. Appeal to be lodged at the secretary's office.
- Livestock exhibits must not be removed until after the grand parade and Produce not before 5pm on the day of the Show and then only by permission from the stewards.
- Stud stock must be registered with their breed societies and must be Brucellosis and Tuberculosis free, stud beef must be correctly tattooed for inspection on the Showground. Stud dairy cattle registration certificates must be available on show day.
- Any person insulting or interfering with the Judges during the Show will be subject to removal from the Showground and the prize (if any) awarded to such person may be absolutely forfeited to the society.
- Attendants in charge of exhibits in horse, cattle and sheep sections are asked to remain in attendance until the judging in their respective classes is completed.
- Every reasonable care must be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the society. Ordinary precautions will be taken to guard against fire or theft to protect the property of the society and the exhibitor. The society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through an exhibitor and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the society blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.
- Persons contravening any of the society's rules or regulations forfeit any prizes which may be awarded them.
- The committee reserves the right to correct typographic errors in this schedule of exhibits and prizes.





## **Section I - Cooking Recipe**

## **POTECA**

Commonly known as every Slovenian housewife's source of pride, Poteca is a traditional cake that is usually prepared for festivities and celebrations such as Christmas and Easter. The cake was derived from the older rolled dough cakes, and it was first mentioned in 1575. Modern versions of Poteca even include chocolate as a filling. This dessert is a very important part of Slovenian cuisine, so much so that it was featured twice on Slovenian postage stamps.

#### NOTE; this recipe requires forward planning

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 225 g butter, cubed
- 1/2 cup milk
- 3 large egg yolks, room temperature, beaten
- 2 x 7 gm packages active dry yeast
- 1/4 cup warm water
- 2 1/2 cups plain flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

#### FILLING:

- 1-2 cups ground walnuts (personal preference)
- 1-2 cups chopped dates
- 1/4 cup milk
- 3 tablespoons plus 1 cup sugar, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 3 large egg whites, room temperature

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. In a small saucepan, melt butter with the milk; cool. Stir in egg yolks until blended. In a small bowl, dissolve yeast in warm water.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugar and salt; add butter mixture and yeast mixture.
- 3. Beat on medium speed for 3 minutes (dough will be sticky). Cover and refrigerate overnight.
- 4. In a small saucepan over medium heat, combine the nuts, dates, milk, 3 tablespoons sugar and cinnamon. Cook and stir until mixture forms a paste. Transfer to a large bowl.
- 5. In a small bowl, beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Gradually beat in remaining sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, on high until stiff peaks form. Fold into nut mixture.
- 6. Cut dough in half; on a floured surface, roll 1 portion into a 20-inch square. Spread with half of the filling. Roll up tightly jelly-roll style. Place, seam side up, in a greased 10-in. tube pan. Repeat with second portion; place, seam side down, over the first roll-up in the pan (layers will bake as 1 loaf).
- 7. Bake at 180° until golden brown, 60-70 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack to cool completely.





## **Section O - Children's Recipes**

## **SALT DOUGH**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

Salt Dough

1 ½ cups plain flour

½ cup fine table salt

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

2/3 cup chilled water

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Preheat oven to 120° C.
- 2. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper.
- 3. Mix flour and salt in a bowl. Make a well in the centre.
- 4. Pour in oil. Gradually add water, stirring mixture with a wooden spoon until combined. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface.
- 5. Knead to make a smooth ball then create item. Place item on trays and bake for 2 ½ hours or until firm and dry. Cool on wire rack.

Example: Christmas hanging items. Roll dough out between 2 sheets baking paper until 7mm thick, use shaped cutters to cut and skewer to make a hole at the top. After cooked and cooled use acrylic paint to paint item while wet can sprinkle with glitter. Thread ribbon to hang.

## **EASY CHOCOLATE SLICE**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 150 g butter melted & cooled
- 200 g (1 cup) brown sugar
- 1 egg lightly beaten
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 60 g (½ cup) plain flour
- 45 g (1/3 cup) self raising flour
- 30 g (¼ cup) cocoa powder
- 40 g (½ cup) desiccated coconut

#### For the icing

- 200 g (1 ½ cups) icing sugar sifted
- 30 g (¼ cup) cocoa powder
- 20 g butter
- 2 tbs boiling water
- sprinkles or 100s and 1000s to decorate

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Conventional Method
- 2. Preheat oven to 160 degrees celsius (fan-forced).
- 3. Grease and line with a 20x20cm square tin with baking paper.
- 4. Place butter, sugar, egg and vanilla in a bowl and stir until combined.
- 5. Sift plain flour, self raising flour and cocoa into bowl. Add the coconut and stir until mixture has combined.
- 6. Spread the mixture evenly into pan and press down with a spoon to flatten the surface. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until just firm.
- 7. To make the icing, sift the icing sugar and cocoa into bowl.
- 8. Add the butter and boiling water and stir together.
- 9. Spread the icing over the still warm slice and decorate with sprinkles.
